


The chapel was funded by a bequest from Jane E. Putnam, wife of Henry C. Putnam, for the people of Eau Claire, to be used for holding services. The chapel was constructed at a cost of approximately \$10,000. The Putnam's were civic-minded people who donated land, money and time to improve the community, assisting in the funding of the First Presbyterian Church and YMCA and founding the public library.

The Chapel has recently undergone some restoration and is now available for Memorial Services only.

- ❖ The chapels may be reserved for \$90/hour with a 2 hour minimum.
- ❖ The chapels are opened & closed onsite by the Sexton, no keys are issued.
- ❖ You may come in at no charge on Friday before the event between 8am-4pm to decorate, as long as there is no conflict with another user.
- ❖ The chapels need to be cleaned and left in the same manner in which they were found.
- ❖ Hoover Chapel is available from 8am-6pm and seats 80 guests (handicap ramp available upon request).
- ❖ Putnam Chapel is available from 8am-6pm and seats 50 guests (not handicap accessible). Memorial Services only
- ❖ Memorial Chapel reservation cannot be made online. All reservations must be submitted in person or via mail/fax to the Recreation Office (*contact information on back*).
